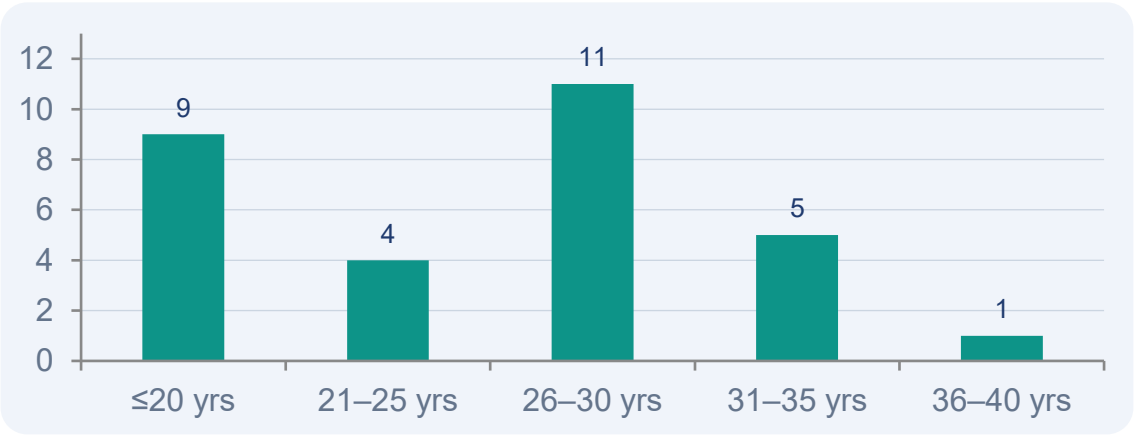

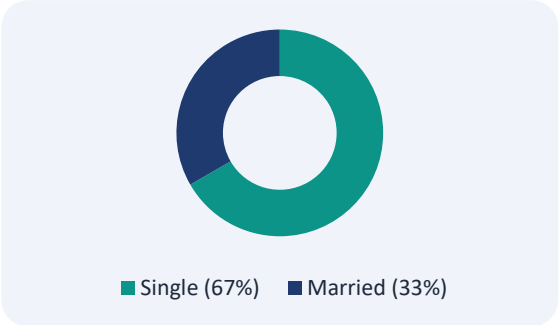

Age Group Distribution

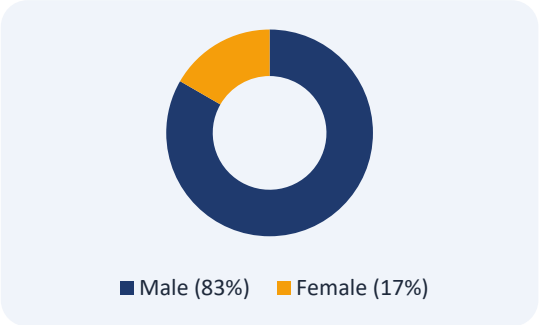
Number of students per age bracket (N=30)

Gender Split



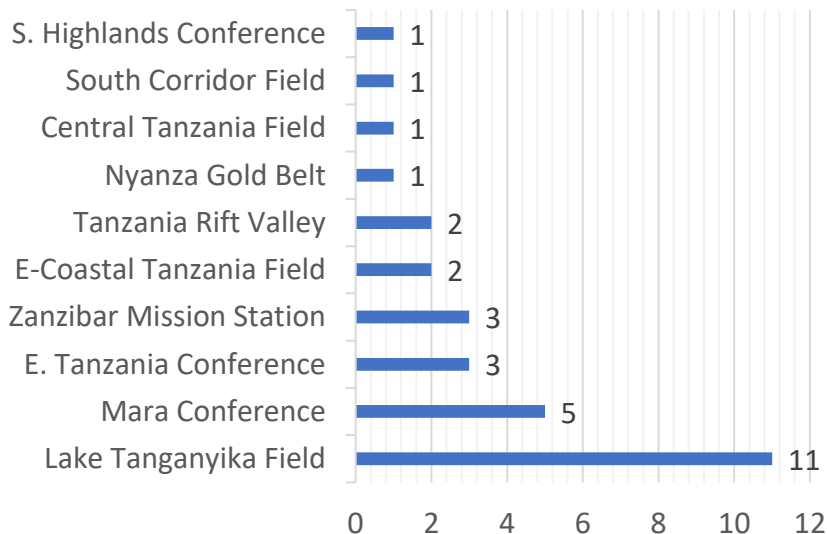

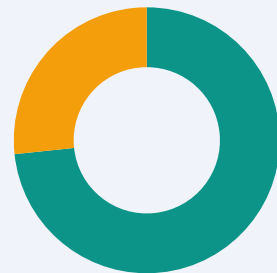

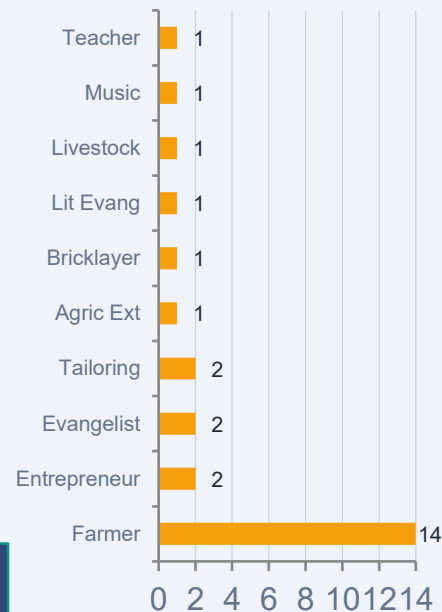

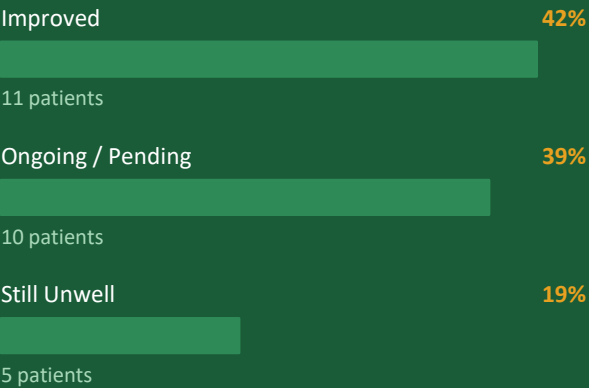

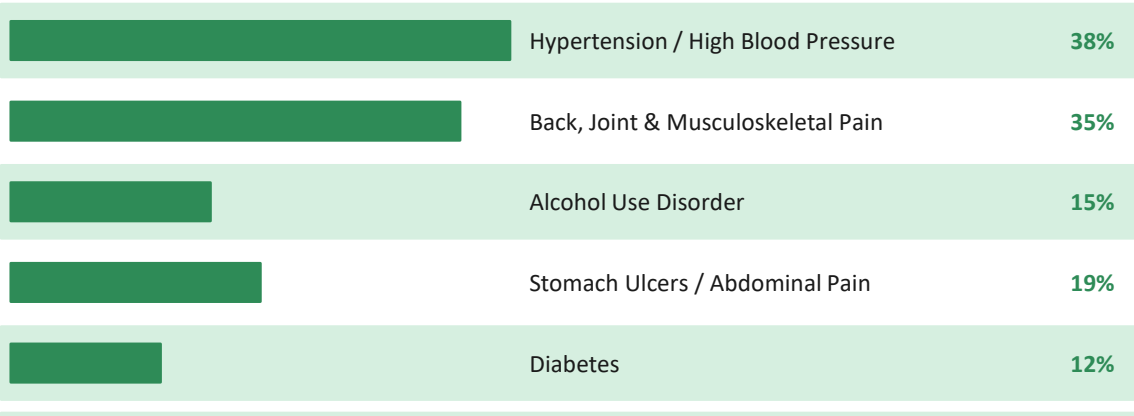

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS

Sabbath Teaching Guide

Develop illustrated, culturally appropriate guide for the most-contested theological topic

Basic Health Kits

Equip each student with a BP monitor, thermometer, and first aid supplies before deployment

Urgent Specialist Referral

Refer patient with heart valve disease, hypertension & alcohol dependency to district hospital

Bible Distribution

Prioritise villages where participants lack Bibles — a prerequisite for sustained study

Addiction Counselling Training

Provide basic motivational interviewing skills to address alcohol dependency cases

30 students · 18 villages · 213 lessons · 280 reached · 26 health patients · 62% continuation
